Curriculum Overview

Summer 2022



Year 6

English

This term, we will continue to use sentence stacking in our lessons with drama and other experiences intertwined in each unit. Our narrative writing focus will use, Moth by Isabel Thomas and Letters from the Lighthouse Keeper by Emma Carroll, as a stimulus to help develop our narrative writing with a focus on figurative language. We will also learn about the language and structure used in writing balanced arguments. Later in the term, we will revisit the language of persuasion studying using Greta, a text outlining the campaigning of Greta Thunberg. Children will be expected to apply of their knowledge of the Year 6 curriculum expectations in final independent pieces.

Physical Education

Year 6 will have two lessons of PE every Thursday afternoon.
