Dear Parents,

I hope you have all enjoyed the sunny weekend and I am hoping we are now officially entering Summer. I would like to say the children are looking very smart in their summer uniform and school PE uniform, thank you for adhering to the school uniform, however, we are experiencing more children not wearing the correct footwear.
