Step 1


Step 2

To access Google Classrooms, enter the web address <http://classroom.google.com>






Step 3

Click on and enter the email address and password to gain access your child's virtual classroom.



Step 4


You will now have gained access to the Google Classroom linked to your child's year group. Class teachers will use the virtual classroom to provide children with high-quality lessons to support their learning in each subject.

What to expect:

- Work will be uploaded for your child to complete.
- Links, PowerPoints and videos will be provided to support learning.
- Messages and video updates from teachers will be posted.
- Pre-recorded videos to support learning will be uploaded.


Step 5

When work has been set by the class teacher, you will be alerted via email. Once logged into Google Classroom, notifications can be seen on the main page. Click on the lesson and follow the instructions.



Step 6

Documents that are uploaded will enable children to actively respond to a task on Google Slides (PowerPoint) or Google Docs (Word). Once your child is happy with their response, they must click the 'Turn In' button to submit their work.




Step 7

Once the piece of work has been completed, it is sent back to the teacher who will look through the work that has been completed. Teachers will respond to work as a whole class and continue with the 'Shout Outs'. Further support will be given to targeted children.

Live and Pre-recorded lessons

There may be occasions where live lessons will be delivered and pre-recorded lessons uploaded. If this is the case, a notification and link will be made available on the Google Classroom page for children to access. When delivering a live lesson, teachers may mute pupil's microphones and blank their screens. (This reduces lag for other students who are using different electrical devices). Within a lesson, children will have the option to type in questions and discuss ideas using the virtual hands up. **The same expectations still apply within a virtual classroom environment. All children are expected to complete their work to the highest standard, reflecting the expectation of their year group.** If for any reason your child cannot attend the live lesson, a recording will be uploaded shortly after the session finishes.
