Year 5

English:

Throughout the spring term, children will produce a variety of piction and non-piction pieces linked to real-lipe experiences and storytelling. To help our writing, we will be studying 'I Believe in Unicorns' by Michael Morpurgo and 'Scott of the Antarctic'. By the end of year 5 children will need to use a wide range of: grammatical devices; spellings and sentences structures. Within each independent piece, children will need to accurately spell all statutory spellings correctly — these can be found in the back of your child's home-school diary. This term, during our whole class reading sessions, we will be reading 'Vi Spy — Licence to Chill' by Maz Evans and 'Friend or Foe' by Michael Morpurgo.

Maths:

Year 5 will be studying the following topics this term in maths.

- Multiplication and divisions
- Fractions
- Decimals and percentages
- Perimeter and area
- Staistics

Areas that require further work, highlighted in the autumn term, will be the focus of some homework tasks, to continue supporting development of key concepts.

Continuing to learn times table packs and the associated division packs is crucial, as it supports mathematical pluency.

Curriculum:

Geography — Year 5 will be going on a journey to Brazil. Throughout the unit, pupils will be encouraged to compare the geography of Brazil to that of the UK. Pupils will begin by studying the human and physical features of Brazil before placing Brazil in the wider context of the world and South America. They will investigate the many differences between urban and rural Brazil and case study the lives of people living within Rio de Janeiro

History —This term we will be travelling back in time to Baghdad in the 10^{th} century and comparing life then to life in London.
